

Dear Sirs or Mesdames:


The health and welfare of our children and grandchildren are our overriding concerns. Therefore the reduction of dangerous environmental pollutants, particularly air neurotoxins including mercury, has a high priority with us. The EPA in 2001 indicated that 90% mercury reduction was achievable for power plants and adopted mercury standards for municipal and hazardous waste incinerators requiring 90% reduction.

We understand that the recent power plant Maximum Achievable Control Technology (MACT) proposal requires only 29% mercury reduction. In our opinion this is an unacceptable reduction of very desirable high standards that should be maintained in view of the real threat to our children and the practical technology available to protect them. Please act responsibly to maintain high MACT standards.
