I am writing to urge you to tighten the Bush administration's proposed fuel-economy standards and compel automakers to build fuel-efficient trucks and SUVs.

Events of the past few months have rendered the administration's new mileage standards obsolete -- if not downright ridiculous. Gas prices have soared to all-time highs and yet the president actually proposes to weaken fuel-efficiency standards for gas-guzzling trucks and SUVs -- and to exempt dinosaurs like the 8,600-pound Hummer from standards altogether.
